

Historical Astronomy Division (HAD)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Events organized by the HAD and are of a similar type to the main AAS events, but on the topic of history in astronomy.
Special Sessions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Suggested and organized by participants. Often run in parallel to oral sessions but with a structure of the organizer's design (as opposed to the standard oral session). Speakers are often invited, and there may be panels etc. These often deal with "state of the profession".
Press Conferences	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Arranged in advance for teams to present breaking news to press, etc. Anyone can attend press conferences and they often provide exciting, specific, science results presented in non-specialist terms.
Splinter	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Similar to special sessions these have usually be organized by attendees. Will be run with a structure designed by whoever is organizing but can last as long as needed (sometimes all day!) More common for observatories/missions.
Workshops	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The weekend preceeding the conference. These often are at cost and are topic specific. Run by interest groups in all areas.
Oral Sessions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Parallel sessions of speakers arranged by topic. The majority of talks are 5 minutes long (unless they are dissertation talks).
Attendee Event	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Events organized by AAS. These are events for all attendees. They often have free food/drink and come with networking opportunities.
Town Hall	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Often given by government bodies (i.e., NASA, NSF) or large missions (i.e., The Nancy Grace Roman Telescope). Can be held in the day or during the evening (where there is sometimes free food and drink).
Exhibit Theater	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A stage within the exhibit hall where exhibitors present short talks/workshops.
iPosters	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All in the exhibit hall. These are organized by session number. In the morning these sessions come with free coffee, in the evening snacks and drinks.
Plenary	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> May also be described as a keynote. Geared towards a general astronomy audience. Nothing else will be scheduled during these times.
